



**Acts of
City Council of Hinton
Regular Meeting
Tuesday June, 18 2013
7:00 p.m. -- Hinton City Hall**

1. Call to order/Roll Call – Mayor Joe Blankenship called the meeting to order and the record showed that Councilman Larry Meador, Councilman Pat Jordan, Councilman Tommy Oxley and Councilman Bobby Basham were all present. City Manager Cris Meadows and City Attorney Richard Gunnoe were also in attendance.
2. Invocation / Pledge of Allegiance – Cris Meadows led the prayer and the pledge of allegiance.
3. Approval of Agenda – Councilman Oxley moved to approve the agenda. Councilman Basham seconded the motion and the motion passed on a vote of 4-0.
4. Approval of Minutes- Councilman Oxley moved to approve the minutes of the May 2013 regular city council meeting. Councilman Jordan seconded the motion and the motion passed on a vote of 4-0.
5. Approval of Paid Invoices – Councilman Jordan moved to approve the paid invoices. Councilman Basham seconded the motion and the motion passed on a vote of 4-0.
6. Approval of Financial Report May 2013 – Councilman Jordan moved to approve the financial report May 2013. Councilman Basham seconded the motion and the motion passed on a vote of 4-0.
7. Approval of Building Permits – Councilman Oxley moved to approve the building permits. Councilman Jordan seconded the motion and the motion passed on a vote of 4-0.
8. Appearance of Citizens – Wes Bennett addressed Council and asked for more to be done about the drug problems in town. Council discussed their concerns and what they were trying to do to help eliminate the drug issues and the stumbling blocks they have encountered. Sheila Allman also discussed her encounter with the drug problems and asked about a soboxin clinic in Beaver and if having one here would help.
9. Discussion and or action regarding Brooks Sewer Project – Councilman Basham moved to approve the payment of the invoices totaling \$278,995.56. Councilman Oxley seconded the motion and the motion passed on a vote of 4-0.
10. Discussion and or action regarding Gold Coast Project – Mayor Blankenship stated that the Sanitary Board has approved a settlement agreement with the parties involved and should be back under construction to fix the problems by late July.
11. Discussion and or action regarding renewal of livestock permit for high school – Councilman Oxley moved to approve the renewal of the annual permit to allow the high school to have live stock for teaching purposes. Councilman Jordan seconded the motion and the motion passed on a vote of 4-0.
12. Adjournment – Councilman Basham moved to adjourn the meeting. Councilman Meador seconded the motion and the motion passed on a vote of 4-0.
