



**Acts of
City Council of Hinton
Regular Meeting
Tuesday, August 16, 2016
7:00 p.m. -- Hinton City Hall**

1. Call to order/Roll Call – Mayor Joe Blankenship called the meeting to order, and the record showed that Councilman Larry Meador, Councilman Jack Scott, Councilman Pat Jordan, and Councilwoman Roberta Sorg were present. City Manager Cris Meadows and City Attorney Richard Gunnoe were also in attendance.
2. Invocation / Pledge of Allegiance – Cris Meadows led the prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance.
3. Approval of Agenda – Councilman Meador moved to approve the agenda. Councilman Jordan seconded the motion, and the motion passed on a vote of 4-0.
4. Approval of Minutes- Councilman Jordan moved to approve the minutes of the July Regular Council Meeting. Councilwoman Sorg seconded the motion. The motion passed on a vote of 4-0.
5. Approval of Paid Invoices – Councilman Jordan moved to approve the paid invoices. Councilwoman Sorg seconded the motion. The motion passed on a vote of 4-0.
6. Approval of Financial Report July 2016 – Councilman Jordan moved to approve the financial report July 2016. Councilman Scott seconded the motion. The motion passed on a vote of 4-0.
7. Appearance of Citizens – Johnathan Lipscomb discussed with council his displeasure with the removal of parking in front of Summers Middle School. He stated that he now has nowhere to park in front of his house due to the changes and asked for clarification on when and if he could park there. Council discussed the change was due to a meeting with school personnel, and he should meet with Chief Snavelly to answer any questions about the parking.
8. Discussion and or action regarding resolution for Tri-Cities Power Authority- Cris stated that the resolution was for the disposal of approximately \$7,800.00 in funds that was given to the Authority by Amp Ohio to use defending us against the Mancor Lawsuit. We won our case, and this is what was left over after the defense of the suit. The money is in a dormant account with Cleo Mathews name on it, and we need this to access and dispose of the money after a meeting with the other cities.
9. Discussion and or action regarding new code adopting ordinance second reading- Richard Gunnoe stated his displeasure with some of the changes and the numbering system. He asked for more time to review it. Councilman Jordan moved to table this till the next meeting.
10. Discussion and or action regarding acceptance of property at 503 Summers Street- Mayor Blankenship stated that we would like to thank Tom Clinebell for the donation of this building. Councilman Scott moved to accept the property. Councilman Jordan seconded the motion, and the motion passed on a vote of 4-0.
11. Discussion and or action regarding Council President – Mayor Blankenship stated that the council needed to vote on a new Council President for the term. This is their choice and not an appointment of his. Councilwoman Sorg moved to reappoint Councilman Larry Meador to continue to serve as Council President. Councilman Jordan seconded the motion, and the motion passed on a vote of 3-0 with Councilman Meador abstaining from the vote.
12. Adjournment – Councilwoman Sorg moved to adjourn the meeting. Councilman Meador seconded the motion, and the motion passed on a vote of 4-0.
