



**Acts of
City Council of Hinton
Regular Meeting
Tuesday, March 20, 2018
7:00 p.m. -- Hinton City Hall**

1. Call to order/Roll Call – Mayor Joe Blankenship called the meeting to order, and the record showed that Councilman Larry Meador, Councilman Pat Jordan, Councilman Jack Scott and Councilwoman Roberta Sorg were present.
2. Invocation / Pledge of Allegiance – City Manager Cris Meadows led the prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance.
3. Approval of Agenda – Councilman Meador moved to approve the agenda. Councilwoman Sorg seconded the motion, and the motion passed on a vote of 4-0.
4. Approval of Minutes- Councilman Meador moved to approve the minutes of the February Regular Council Meeting. Councilman Jordan seconded the motion. The motion passed by a vote of 4-0.
5. Approval of Paid Invoices – Councilman Jordan moved to approve the paid invoices. Councilwoman Sorg seconded the motion. The motion passed by a vote of 4-0.
6. Approval of Financial Report February 2018 – Councilman Jordan moved to approve the financial report. Councilman Scott seconded the motion. The motion passed by a vote of 4-0.
7. Approval of the budget for 2018-2019 fiscal year – Cris went over the budget as it was prepared. Mayor Blankenship stated the budget was balanced and edited per the discussion in the budget meeting. Councilman Jordan moved to approve the list of the noted changes. Councilman Scott seconded the motion and the motion passed on a vote of 4-0.
8. The appearance of Citizens – Keith Collins with Sprint discussed the new expansion and their willingness to locate a store in the area.
Fred Long asked council about his grievance with the HHLC. Richard Gunnoe stated that we won our case against Fred and that all he really needed to do was fill out a permit application completely and once approved by the HHLC he could paint the door.
9. Discussion and or action regarding freight depot – no action was taken
10. Discussion and or action regarding the police station – Chief Snavelly stated that he had underestimated the server for the new station and that it cost \$15,000 where he had estimated \$4-6,000. Greenbrier Technology came to explain the need for the server and what the needs of the department are. Councilman Meador moved to approve the purchase. Councilwoman Sorg seconded the motion but asked for the amendment that it must be financed. The motion and amendment passed on a vote of 4-0.
11. Councilwoman Sorg moved to adjourn the meeting. Councilman Jordan seconded the motion, and the motion passed on a vote of 4-0.
