



**Acts of
City Council of Hinton
Regular Meeting
Tuesday, May 21, 2019
7:00 p.m. -- Hinton City Hall**

1. Call to order/Roll Call – Mayor Joe Blankenship called the meeting to order, and the record showed that Councilman Jack Scott, Councilman Pat Jordan, and Councilwoman Roberta Sorg were present. Councilman Meador was present by teleconference.
2. Invocation / Pledge of Allegiance – Cris Meadows led the prayer and pledge.
3. Approval of Agenda – Councilman Jordan moved to approve the agenda. Councilwoman Sorg seconded the motion, and the motion passed on a vote of 4-0.
4. Approval of Minutes- Councilman Scott moved to approve the minutes of the April Regular Council Meeting. Councilman Jordan seconded the motion. The motion passed by a vote of 4-0.
5. Approval of Paid Invoices – Councilman Jordan moved to approve the paid invoices. Councilwoman Sorg seconded the motion. The motion passed by a vote of 4-0.
6. Approval of Financial Report April 2019 – Councilman Scott moved to approve the financial report. Councilman Jordan seconded the motion. The motion passed by a vote of 4-0
7. The appearance of Citizens – no citizens were in attendance
8. Discussion and or action regarding fire truck bids – Cris stated that he had an advertisement out to sell the 1974 Mack fire truck. Two bids were received in a timely fashion and were in sealed envelopes to be opened by the council. Mayor Blankenship then opened and read the bids. Bo Donahoe bid \$3,000 and Anthony Bowden bid \$2,000. Councilman Scott moved to accept the bids and to award the truck to the high bidder Bo Donahoe for \$3,000. Councilman Jordan seconded the motion and the motion passed on a vote of 4-0.
9. Discussion regarding joining the home rule program – Council discussed the many benefits in the home rule program. They directed Cris to follow up and bring more information to the next meeting.
10. Discussion regarding annexation – the council discussed that with the addition of the home rule program there should be little resistance to adding in the Bypass into the city limits. The current businesses would only benefit and not have any additional tax burden through the B&O program as it would be just sales tax that they would be paying along with the city levy taxes.
11. Councilwoman Sorg moved to adjourn the meeting. Councilman Scott seconded the motion, and the motion passed on a vote of 4-0.
